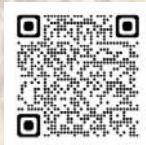

Migrant Liaisons

Each district in Minnesota should have one person designated as their Migrant Liaison. When Tri-Valley (TVOC) Migrant Education Services determines a student is eligible for the Migrant Education Program, the Migrant Liaison of the district will be notified.

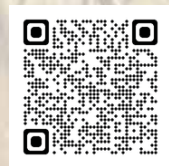
Migrant Liaisons can assist by ensuring the district has indicators in registration forms, advocating for migratory students, completing Recruitment Requests, and submitting required reports, student data, and transcripts to TVOC.

Migrant Liaisons and other district staff are eligible to obtain an MSIX account! This national database will be helpful in looking at school history and assessment data, correctly placing migratory students in courses and more!
