


what is mmerc?


MSIF (Migrant Student Information Form) Office Hours:



women's history month




what is women's history month?

c.h.a.t. mentoring program



what is c.h.a.t.?

CHAT stands for Conversations Happening to Achieve Together and it's a virtual mentoring program available for eligible Kindergarten through 12th grade students and Out-of-School-Youth (OSY). Our goal is to provide a safe, flexible and supporting environment to help remove barriers and ensure student and youth resilience and success. We offer one-on-one or group sessions where students and youth can explore a variety of topics including school-related topics, career and college exploration, wellness and mental health topics, and any individual needs.
